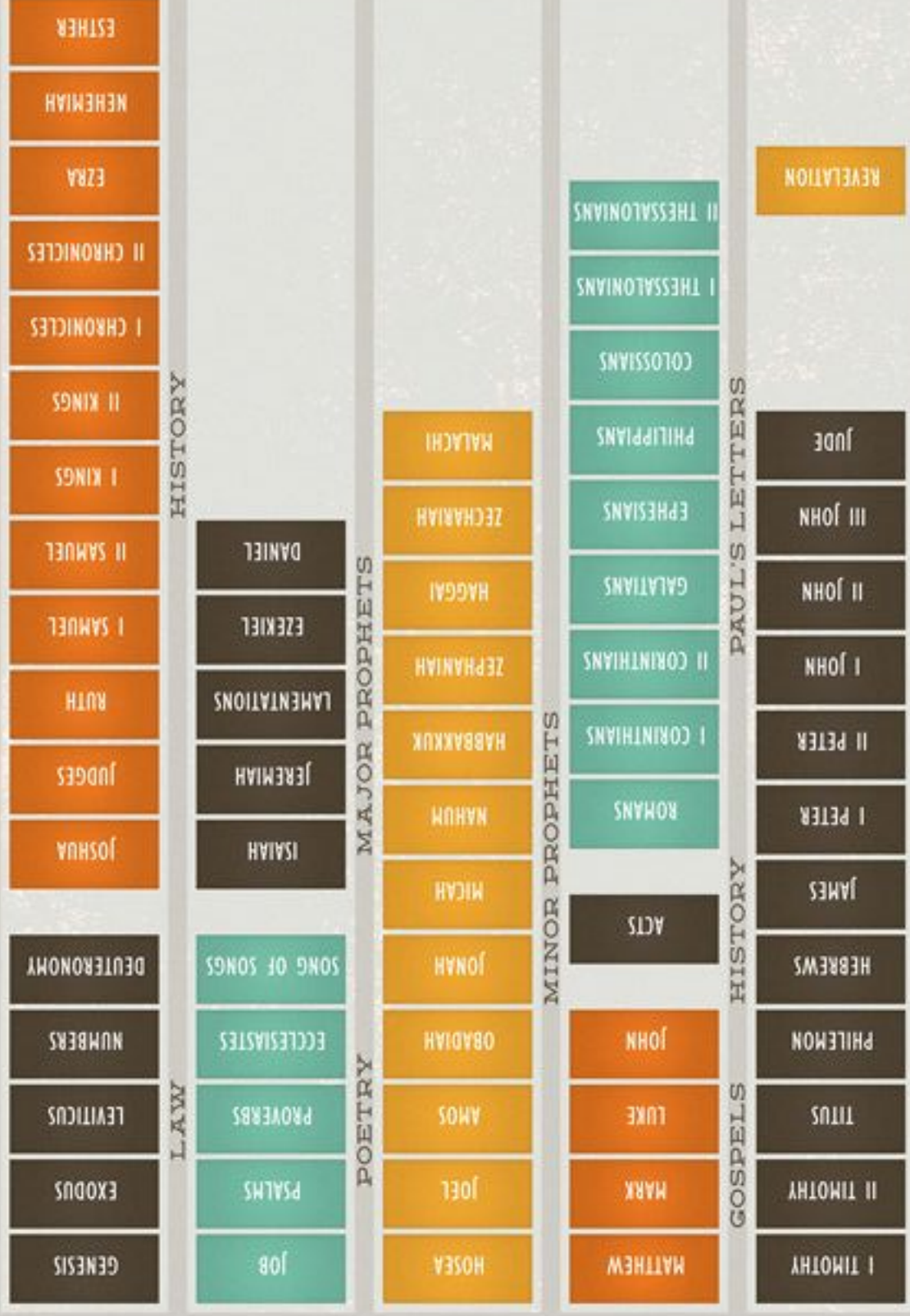
- 1. Q. **Who made you?** A. *God*
- 2. Q. **What else did God make?** A. *God made all things.*
- 3. Q. **Why did God make you and all things?** A. *For His own glory.*
- 4. Q. **How can you glorify God?** A. *By loving Him and doing what He commands.*
- 5. Q. **Why ought you to glorify God?** A. *Because He made me and takes care of me.*
- 6. Q. **Are there more gods than one?** A. *There is only one true God.*
- 7. Q. **In how many persons does this one God exist?** A. *In three persons.*
- 8. Q. **What are they?** A. *The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.*
- 9. Q. **What is God?** A. *God is a spirit, and has not a body like men.*
- 10. Q. **Where is God?** A. *God is everywhere.*
- 11. Q. **Can you see God?** A. *No; I cannot see God, but He always sees me.*
- 12. Q. **Does God know all things?** A. *Yes; nothing can be hid from God.*
- 13. Q. **Can God do all things?** A. *Yes; God can do all His holy will.*
- 14. Q. **Where do you learn how to love and obey God?** A. *In the Bible alone.*

- 15. Q. **Who wrote the Bible?** A. *Chosen men who wrote by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.*
- 16. Q. **Who were our first parents?** A. *Adam and Eve.*
- 17. Q. **Of what were our first parents made?** A. *God made the body of Adam out of the ground, and formed Eve from the body of Adam.*
- 18. Q. **What did God give Adam and Eve besides bodies?** A. *He gave them souls that could never die.*
- 19. Q. **Have you a soul as well as a body?** A. *Yes; I have a soul that can never die.*
- 20. Q. **How do you know that you have a soul?** A. *Because I can think about God and the world to come.*
- 21. Q. **In what condition did God make Adam and Eve?** A. *He made them holy and happy.*
- 22. Q. **What is a covenant?** A. *An agreement between two or more persons.*
- 23. Q. **What covenant did God make with Adam?** A. *The covenant of works.*
- 24. Q. **What was Adam bound to do by the covenant of works?** A. *To obey God perfectly.*
- 25. Q. **What did God promise in the covenant of works?** A. *To reward Adam with life if he obeyed Him.*
- 26. Q. **What did God threaten in the covenant of works?** A. *To punish Adam with death if he disobeyed.*
- 27. Q. **Did Adam keep the covenant of works?** A. *No; he sinned against God.*
- 28. Q. **What is sin?** A. *Any thought, word or deed that breaks God's law by omission or commission.*
- 29. Q. **What is a sin of omission?** A. *Not being or doing what God requires.*
- 30. Q. **What is a sin of commission?** A. *Doing what God forbids.*
- 31. Q. **What was the sin of our first parents?** A. *Eating the forbidden fruit.*
- 32. Q. **Who tempted them to this sin?** A. *The devil tempted Eve, and she gave the fruit to Adam.*
- 33. Q. **What befell our first parents when they had sinned?** A. *Instead of being holy and happy, they became sinful and miserable.*
- 34. Q. **Did Adam act for himself alone in the covenant of works?** A. *No, he represented the whole human race.*
- 35. Q. **What effect had the sin of Adam on all mankind?** A. *All mankind are born in a state of sin and misery.*

36. Q. **What is that sinful nature which we inherit from Adam called?** A. *Original sin.*
37. Q. **What does every sin deserve?** A. *The wrath and curse of God.*
38. Q. **Can anyone go to heaven with this sinful nature?** A. *No; our hearts must be changed before we can be fit for Heaven.*
39. Q. **What is a change of heart called?** A. *Regeneration.*
40. Q. **Who can change a sinner's heart?** A. *The Holy Spirit alone.*
41. Q. **Can anyone be saved through the covenant of works?** A. *None can be saved through the covenant of works.*
42. Q. **Why can none be saved through the covenant of works?** A. *Because all have broken it, and are condemned by it.*
43. Q. **With whom did God the Father make the covenant of grace?** A. *With Christ, His eternal Son.*
44. Q. **Whom did Christ represent in the covenant of grace?** A. *His elect people.*
45. Q. **How did Jesus fulfill the covenant of grace?** A. *He kept the whole law for His people, and then was punished for all of their sins.*
46. Q. **Did our Lord Jesus Christ ever commit the least sin?** A. *No, He lived a sinless life.*
47. Q. **How could the Son of God suffer?** A. *Christ, the Son of God, became man that He might obey and suffer in our nature.*
48. Q. **What is meant by the atonement?** A. *Christ's satisfying divine justice, by His sufferings and death, in the place of sinners.*
49. Q. **What did God the Father undertake in the covenant of grace?** A. *To justify and sanctify those for whom Christ should die.*
50. Q. **What is justification?** A. *It is God's forgiving sinners and treating them as if they had never sinned.*
51. Q. **What is sanctification?** A. *It is God's making sinners holy in heart and conduct.*
52. Q. **For whom did Christ obey and suffer?** A. *For those whom the Father had given Him.*
53. Q. **What kind of life did Christ live on earth?** A. *A life of poverty and suffering.*
54. Q. **What kind of death did Christ die?** A. *The painful and shameful death of the cross.*

- 55. Q. **Who will be saved?** A. *Only those who repent of sin, believe in Christ, and lead holy lives.*
- 56. Q. **What is it to repent?** A. *To be sorry for sin, and to hate and forsake it, because it is displeasing to God.*
- 57. Q. **What is it to believe or have faith in Christ?** A. *To trust in Christ alone for salvation.*
- 58. Q. **Can you repent and believe in Christ by your own power?** A. *No; I can do nothing good without the help of God's Holy Spirit.*
- 59. Q. **How can you get the help of the Holy Spirit?** A. *God has told us that we must pray to Him for the Holy Spirit.*
- 60. Q. **How long ago is it since Christ died?** A. *About two thousand years.*
